<p>30– How can you obtain a copy of the Duty to God brochure?</p> <p><i>From the local council (the council orders them from BSA National Religious Relationships); A printable form is available at www.praypub.org</i></p>	<p>30 – Can a Scout earn more than one emblem?</p> <p><i>Yes, Scouts may earn all levels of their religious emblems program as long as they meet the appropriate age/grade requirements.</i></p>	<p>30 – Why must parents review the program guidelines?</p> <p><i>Each program sets its own guidelines as to age/grade requirements, who can serve as counselor, and whether participants must be official members of religious institution.</i></p>	<p>30 – True/False: Mixed troops (of different religions) cannot participate in the religious emblems programs.</p> <p><i>False: Of course they can. Each child would need the appropriate book for his specific faith.</i></p>	<p>30 – Name the religion of the Dharma award.</p> <p><i>Hindu</i></p>
<p>40 – True/False: You cannot do a presentation on the religious emblems without the video.</p> <p><i>False. The video is an excellent resource, but it is not required; the script provides all the necessary information about the religious emblems programs.</i></p>	<p>40 – How is the award presented? (in what setting?)</p> <p><i>In the religious institution by the religious leader; the square knot should be presented by the Scout leader in an award ceremony</i></p>	<p>40 – When do you pin a “device” on the square knot?</p> <p><i>When you earn more than one religious emblem. The devices will show at which levels you earned a religious emblem</i></p>	<p>40 – When can a leader wear the religious square knot on the adult uniform?</p> <p><i>When the leader has earned the religious emblem as a youth. or when the leader has been nominated for an adult religious recognition.</i></p>	<p>40 – Name the religion of the “That of God” award.</p> <p><i>Quaker/Friends</i></p>

<p>6 0– Whom can you contact if you have questions on the religious emblems programs?</p> <p><i>The name of the presenter; the national religious organizations listed in the Duty to God brochure; P.R.A.Y.</i></p>	<p>60 – How do young people get started on these programs? What are the 4 steps?</p> <p><i>1. Get the book; 2. Review guidelines; 3. Talk to religious leader; 4. Complete requirements, obtain signatures & order award</i></p>	<p>60 – The script uses “interfaith terminology.” Can you find 2 examples? <i>Religious leader(instead of pastor, rabbi,priest); religious institution (not church,temple); Religious emblems programs (not God and Country); religion (not denomination)</i></p>	<p>60 – What are some ways a leader can promote the religious emblems programs?</p> <p><i>By making a presentation; earning the Duty to God Promotion Patch; setting goals; recognizing recipients; planning a joint service project; visiting each other’s places of worship</i></p>	<p>60 – Name at least 5 adult awards.</p> <p><i>God & Service, Distinguished Youth Service, Good Shepherd, St. George, Faithful Servant, On My Honor, Prophet Elias, Dharma Saathi, Allaha Akber, Shofar, Lamb, etc.</i></p>
