

My Promise, My Faith + Bible Basics RP3

“Birds of the Air” Patch

Required: *Bible Basics RP3 Curriculum Pamphlet: Birds of the Air* [a free download from P.R.A.Y.]

STEP 1 >

Choose one line from the Girl Scout Law. Find a story, song, or poem from your faith with the same ideas. Talk with your family or friends about what that line of the Law and the story, song, or poem have in common.

“Use Resources Wisely” and “The Creation Story” – see Step 2

STEP 2 >

Find a woman in your own or another faith community. Ask her how she tries to use that line of the Law in her life.

With your parent/guardian or leader, read the following story out loud to each other and then answer the questions.

Genesis Chapter 1

1 In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

20-21 God said ... Let the skies be filled with birds of every kind...And God saw that it was good.

26-28 Then God said, “Let us make human beings in our image, to be like us. They will reign over the fish in the sea, the birds in the sky, the livestock, all the wild animals on the earth, and the small animals that scurry along the ground.” So God created human beings in his own image. In the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. Then God blessed them and said, “Be fruitful and multiply. Fill the earth and govern it. Reign over the fish in the sea, the birds in the sky, and all the animals that scurry along the ground.”

- Who created you? How does this make you feel?
- What do you think it means to be created in God’s image?
- God instructs us to “govern” the earth and to “reign” over all the creatures. What does this mean? [In Genesis 2, the Bible says that God placed man in the garden of Eden to “tend and watch over it.” How does this add to your understanding?]
- What does this have to do with “use resources wisely” from the Girl Scout Law? Does it surprise you that the GS Law is connected to the Bible? Explain.
- God filled the skies with birds of every kind. How many different birds can you list?
- How do birds reveal God’s creativity and beauty?
- Are birds endangered?
- How does “using resources wisely” help protect birds and their natural environment?
- What can you do to help care for birds?
- Tell of a time you enjoyed being in the outdoors.
- Say a prayer together to thank God for all of creation. Ask God for help in caring for all creation.

STEP 3 >

Gather three inspirational quotes by women that fit with that line of the Girl Scout Law. Put them where you can see them every day!

STEP 4 >

Make something to remind you of what you've learned. It might be a drawing, painting, or poster. You could also make up a story or a skit.

Steps 3 and 4 will be combined using the "Birds of the Air" RP3 Curriculum Pamphlet. Instead of 3 quotes, you will go above and beyond and read 3 Bible stories. You will also make something or do activities to help you remember what you learned in each story:

STEP 5 >

Maybe you can show them what you just made or perform your skit!
