

My Promise, My Faith + Bible Basics RP3

“Bread of Life” Patch

Required: *Bible Basics RP3 Curriculum Pamphlet: Bread of Life* [a free download from P.R.A.Y.]

STEP 1 >

Choose one line from the Girl Scout Law. Find a story, song, or poem from your faith with the same ideas. Talk with your family or friends about what that line of the Law and the story, song, or poem have in common.

“Respect Authority” and Matthew 4:4 – see Step 2

STEP 2 >

Find a woman in your own or another faith community. Ask her how she tries to use that line of the Law in her life.

With your parent/guardian or leader, read the following Bible verse out loud to each other and then answer the questions.

Jesus answered, “It is written: ‘Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.’”
Matthew 4:4 (NIV)

Discussion Questions:

- Define “respect.” Define “authority.” What does “Respect Authority” mean to you?
- Name some “authorities” in your life. What responsibilities do they have?
- What about adults, do they have to respect authority?
- What does it feel like to respect authority? What does it feel like when you do NOT respect authority?

- We often think of people in authority. How is the Bible an authority?
- In Matthew 4:4, what does it mean that we should live “on every word that comes from the mouth of God”?
- How can the Bible be part of your everyday life? How can you respect the Bible and its authority?
- When you read Matthew 4:4, does anybody come to mind? Can you name people whose lives show respect for the Bible, respect for God?
- Tell how your family can be more respectful of the Bible.

- Does it surprise you that the Girl Scout Law is connected to the Bible?
- Say a prayer together. Thank God for the authorities in your life that help care for you and protect you. Thank God for speaking to us through the Bible. Ask God to help you give control over your life to Him. Thank God for the blessings that come from an obedient life.

STEP 3 >

Gather three inspirational quotes by women that fit with that line of the Girl Scout Law. Put them where you can see them every day!

STEP 4 >

Make something to remind you of what you've learned. It might be a drawing, painting, or poster. You could also make up a story or a skit.

Steps 3 and 4 will be combined using the “Bread of Life” RP3 Curriculum Pamphlet. Instead of 3 quotes, you will go above and beyond and read 3 Bible stories. You will also make something or do activities to help you remember what you learned in each story:



- Story #1: Manna from Heaven
- Story #2: Jesus Feeds the 5000
- Story #3: The Last Supper

STEP 5 >

Keep the connection strong. Find out if your faith community offers a recognition program for Girl Scouts. Talk with your friends, family, or a group in your faith community about what you've learned about your faith and Girl Scouting. Ask them to help you live the Law and your faith. Maybe you can show them what you just made or perform your skit!

One way to keep the connection strong, is to earn your P.R.A.Y. Religious Award based on your grade:

Jesus and Me (K-1), God and Me (grades 2-3), God and Family (grades 4-6), God and Church (grades 6-8), God and Life (grades 9-12)
