



God and Me: Final Review

These are questions that can aid the pastor in conducting a final review of the *God and Me* curriculum. Please do not ask all the questions. The intent of the final review is not to quiz or “stump” the child, but to dialogue with the child and help him or her express what she has learned. The questions below are to be used to discover what the child is eager to share with you. Find the questions that resonate with the child. The first set of questions review the book lesson-by-lesson. The last set of questions focus on the GAMEBox.

The final review may be done with one child or with a group of children.

God and Me Student Workbook

God and Me is designed to help children become best friends with Jesus and tell their story of “God and Me” together.

Lesson 1: God Created Me - Children studied the creation story and learned that God was pleased with all creation. They acknowledged God as Creator and gave praise to God.

1. Tell me about the “scribble pet” you made on page 4.
2. What do you remember about the creation story? What was your favorite discovery outside? – p.5
3. Show me your picture on page 6. Which is your favorite comment? Who wrote it? [If possible, add your own comment to this page!]
4. Tell me about the Family Project you did for Lesson 1 (page 11).

Lesson 2: Jesus is God’s Gift to Me - Children learned of God’s love through Jesus. They told parallel stories of their own birth and the birth of Jesus and proclaimed that Jesus was born to be their Savior.

1. You had to draw one of your favorite gifts on page 12. What was it? Why is it special?
2. The pictures on p. 13 tell the story of Jesus’ birth. What is your favorite part? Explain.
3. Let’s take turns reading the stories on p. 14. I’ll read a line from Jesus’ story, and then you’ll read a line from your story.
4. What was God’s special gift to us? Why is Jesus so special? Read John 3:16 on page 15.
5. Tell me about one picture on the bottom of p. 15. What can you do to help other people?
6. Tell me about the Family Project you did for Lesson 2 (page 16).

Lesson 3: I Can Talk with God - Children learned how important prayer was to Jesus and that God wants them to pray. They learned four parts of prayer to help them share their thoughts with God and were required to memorize the Lord’s Prayer.

1. Can you pray the Lord’s Prayer with me? (Add your signature to page 37.)
2. What is one thing you try to do when you pray? p. 20
3. What does PATH stand for? Do you remember the hand gestures? p. 20
4. Tell me the story about Samuel. I like the way it reminds us to listen to God. p. 22
5. How did you enjoy doing the breath prayer? The prayer walk? p. 22
6. Tell me about the Family Project you did for Lesson 3. (page 25)

Lesson 4: Because God Cares for Me, I Can Care for Others - Children learned that God is their Good Shepherd, and they were challenged to reach out and be “good shepherds” to those around them.

1. Who is the Good Shepherd? How is Jesus like a shepherd? p. 27
2. What community helper did you draw on page 27?
3. Tell me about Zacchaeus. What did you like about this story?
4. How can you be a good shepherd to other people? (page 28)
5. Tell me about the Family Project you did for Lesson 4. (page 30)

GAMEBox

The word GAMEBox stands for “**G**od **A**nd **M**e Exploring Box.” The children made four different games to keep in their game boxes. The games were based on the Bible stories they studied.

Encourage the child to freely talk about the games. You may want to know what the connection was between the game and the Bible lesson, but the child may be more interested in talking about how he or she made the game, and who won when the family played the game at home.

1. First, show me the hands on your GAMEBox. What did you draw?
2. I know you made a matching or memory game (p. 11). Show me some of the pictures that you drew.
3. The Guessing Game was when you had to pin a name on somebody’s back and guess who you were (p. 16). I’ll challenge you. Go ahead and pin a name on my back, and let’s see how long it takes before I guess the answer. And then I’ll pin a name on your back, and see how long it takes before you guess the answer.
4. Tell me about your prayer cube (p. 25). Can you demonstrate how it works?
5. Show me your board game. Can I ask you some of the questions on the game cards?
6. What was your favorite game? Why?

To the pastor: If possible, please add a personal note to the child encouraging him or her to stay close to Jesus.
