

Jesus and Me Final Review

These are questions that can aid the pastor in conducting a final review of the God and Me curriculum. Please do not ask all the questions. The intent of the final review is not to quiz or “stump” the child, but to dialogue with the child and help him or her express what she has learned. The questions below are to be used to discover what the child is eager to share with you. Find the questions that resonate with the child. The questions cover the Workbook and the Jesus Craft Scroll.

The final review may be done with one child or with a group of children.

Jesus and Me Student Workbook

Jesus and Me is designed to introduce Jesus as the Son of God but in familiar terms so that young children can see Jesus in their own day-to-day experiences as storyteller, teacher, friend, and healer.

Session 1: Jesus Was a Storyteller - Children told their own imaginary story, talked about the importance of stories, and heard the story of Jesus telling the parable of the sower.

1. Tell me the story that you made up on page 3.
2. Read each part of God’s Big Story on page 4 and ask the child to tell you about the pictures (or stickers, or colors) that they chose.
3. Page 5 has a picture of the Parable of the Sower. Where will the seed grow the best? Tell me about the different soils in this picture.
4. Show me “Jesus Was a Storyteller” in your scroll.
5. Do you remember your memory verse? “And Jesus told them many things in parables.” Matthew 13:3a NRSV

Session 2: Jesus Was a Teacher - Children talked about their teachers, pretended to be a teacher, and heard how Jesus taught his disciples and all the people.

1. Tell me who the teachers are on page 6. What are they teaching?
2. What are some things that Jesus taught?
3. Can you show me the sign language for “teacher?”
4. Show me “Jesus Was a Teacher” in your scroll.
5. Do you remember your memory verse? “Then Jesus went about among the villages teaching.” Mark 6:6b NRSV

Session 3: Jesus Was a Friend - Children talked about the fun things they like to do with their friends, they heard about Jesus' friends Mary, Martha, and Lazarus, and they learned how to greet new friends. They also added bookmarks to their Bibles to find the 4 Gospels.

1. Which activity is your favorite on page 10?
2. What are the four Gospels?
3. Let's try the Finger Play together on page 13, "We're Friends!"
4. Tell me about Jesus' friends, Mary, Martha and Lazarus. What do you remember about them?
5. Show me "Jesus Was a Friend" in your scroll.
6. Do you remember your memory verse? "I have called you friends." John 15:15b NRSV

Session 4: Jesus Was a Healer - Children identified people who are healers and they heard the story of Jesus healing the man with leprosy and they acted out this story.

1. Tell me about the healers on page 17.
2. Show me the picture you colored on page 18 and tell me the story of Jesus healing the man with leprosy.
3. Explain your Before and After pictures page 22.
4. Show me "Jesus Was a Healer" in your scroll. Tell me the story using the cutout figures.
5. Do you remember your memory verse? "Jesus cured all who were sick." Matthew 8:16b NRSV

Wrap-up

The "Match It Up" activity on page 19 helps to summarize the *Jesus and Me* program. Remind the child that we are to follow Jesus' example and be storytellers, teachers, friends, and healers to those around us.

To the pastor: If possible, please add a personal note to the child encouraging him or her to stay close to Jesus. Perhaps your comments can be written on page 20.
